A reflection on this week's readings

From the readings for Sunday 21st April

John 10:15-18

I lay down my life for the sheep. And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, *and* one shepherd. Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father.

AV (King James Bible)

I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep, that are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life, that I may take it again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again; this charge I have received from my Father.

I am giving my life for the sake of the sheep. And I have other sheep who do not belong to this fold. I must lead these also, and they will hear my voice. So there will be one flock and one shepherd. This is the reason why the Father loves me—that I lay down my life, and I lay it down to take it up again! No one is taking it from me, but I lay it down of my own free will. I have the power to lay it down and I have the power to take it up again. This is an order that I have received from my Father.

I put the sheep before myself, sacrificing myself if necessary. You need to know that I have other sheep in addition to those in this pen. I need to gather and bring them, too. They'll also recognize my voice. Then it will be one flock, one Shepherd. This is why the Father loves me: because I freely lay down my life. And so I am free to take it up again. No one takes it from me. I lay it down of my own free will. I have the right to lay it down; I also have the right to take it up again. I received this authority personally from my Father.

The Message

You may recall the reading from John 12, back before Easter, in which some Greeks wanted to see Jesus, prompting his prophecy that, just as the grain of wheat must be buried in the ground to give a bountiful harvest, so he must die in order to achieve his saving mission. What was striking was his air of calm self-control when speaking of his death, though he admitted that his soul was "troubled". Today's reading shows that this should not have come as a surprise; the same tone of calm and control is seen here, linked with his special relationship with the Father. For the writer of this gospel, the key thing is to emphasise Jesus' fully divine status (what we call a "high Christology"); for some readers this creates a less humanly sympathetic Jesus than the one we meet in the other gospels (though John's Jesus shows his human side too, in the festive comedy of the Cana wedding, and the intriguing conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4). What can't be denied is that the Jesus we meet here is a deeply impressive figure, with a commanding spiritual authority.

The other gospels have episodes in which Jesus is seen reaching out to the Gentile world (the healing of the centurion's servant in Matthew 8:5-15, and –after a rather tetchy conversation – that of the Syro-Phoenician woman's daughter in Mark 7:24-30), and Matthew famously ends with the "Great Commission" to teach all nations, but here we see Jesus emphasising almost from the outset that he has "other sheep not of this fold". For this gospel writer, the separation between Jews and Christians has irrevocably happened (and indeed he shows at times a degree of hostility to Jews as such that we don't find in the other gospels); it is important for his "high" portrayal of Jesus that this outreach to the wider Gentile world should be clearly seen as part of the plan all along.

Understanding that while the gospels were written by different human individuals with their own emphases and points of view, they are all in a profound sense the inspired word of God for our salvation, let us hope to encounter in our prayer life the strong, calm and loving authority of John's Jesus, while regretting the asperity shown towards the Jews and praying for a better and fuller understanding in this troubled world among all the "Abrahamic" faiths.
